**1. Title of the Practice:** Exploration of tangible and intangible components: Architecture and beyond

Architectural Study tours are conducted for all students of First year to Fourth Year B. Arch. for studying tangible components of architecture and intangible socio-cultural dimensions of various places. Study tours give exposure and experience to students of various places, which were mostly unknown to them. The competitions of the study tour presentation and reports amongst the classes are held in front of a panel of jurors.

**2. Objectives of the Practice:** To fulfil two objectives as

Documentation of intensive works of the students under the able guidance of faculty, which are archived in the college and uploaded in the college website for everyone to refer.

Competitions help to set high benchmark and give students opportunities to experiment with various digital media, making of physical models and excel their work, graphical presentation and communication skills.

- **3. The Context:** Study tours are linked with Architectural Design Projects as per curriculum requirements so that students get opportunity to design in various geographical settings.
- **4. The Practice -** Architectural Study tours are conducted every year, students visit places from various geographical areas to study natural and cultural context to understand architecture of that place and they need to design a project in that place in Architectural Design studio. The places are selected according to the curriculum requirement for the subject of Architectural Design progressively from smaller settlements in First year to high order urban areas in fourth year. These tours are accompanied by faculty members who guide the study for entire duration.

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The study includes tangible components of architectural like site context, spatial forms and attributes, along with intangible aspects like customs, behavior, cultural traditions, etc. of the people and place.

The competitions of the study and documentation are held year wise amongst all divisions through audio-visual presentation and first prize is declared for the best documentation and presentation by a panel of jurors. The reports prepared by the students of each year of each division are collected and compiled to publish in print and uploaded in website.

Students of each class are divided with a number of groups and are assigned with various aspects of study. Study for entire task is divided into four parts:

Pre-study of the area and context

Survey and study during visit

Post study tour presentation, documentation, and preparation of report

Architectural Design project in selected site

**5. Evidence of Success:** Architectural study tours are considered with immense importance for systematic field exploration of natural and socio-cultural determinants to architectural manifestation. The bench mark of academic goal is elevated quantitatively and qualitatively as evident in the presentations.

**6. Problems Encountered and Resources Required:** Virtual tours were conducted in last two years during pandemic; though it was difficult to get authentic data and sources to design in context. Study tour is not affordable to all students though institute emphasizes on focused tour in limited places to cut down the cost.

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
